The Rural Alaska Community Action Program, Inc. (RurAL CAP), founded in 1965, is a private, statewide, nonprofit organization working to improve the quality of life for low-income Alaskans. Governed by a 24-member Board of Directors representing every region of the state, RurAL CAP is one of the largest and most diversified organizations in Alaska.



2009 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Agency Wide:

- ❖ 859 Alaskans employed in 79 communities
- ❖ 638 employees from rural Alaska
- ❖ \$26.8 million budget supported RurAL CAP's service programs

Anchorage Services Division:

- ❖ 100 referrals made to chronically homeless Alaskans through Homeless Outreach and Homeward Bound
- ❖ Increased Affordable Housing inventory from 50 units in 2008 to 64 units in 2009
- ❖ Purchase of land in for the construction of a new 7-unit Affordable Housing project

Child Development Division:

- ❖ 1,569 children served in all programs, birth through preschool
- ❖ 1,168 children received developmental screenings
- ❖ 87 children with special needs served

Community Development Division:

- ❖ 2,870 community volunteers were recruited by AmeriCorps members
- ❖ Launched the Energy Wise program to provide 2,200 homes in rural Alaska with energy conservation services
- ❖ Diverted over 135,000 pounds of solid waste from landfills

Rural Housing & Planning Division:

- ❖ 343 homes weatherized in 12 communities
- ❖ 10 self-help, owner-built homes completed in Kenai
- ❖ Provided direct in-depth technical planning assistance to 10 rural communities
